- Prepares First Nation Community Plans and Land Use Plans, and School Feasibility and Infrastructure Studies, including managing and stakeholder and Community engagement and coordinating other disciplines.
- Prepares Recreation Planning documents including Master Parks Plans and Active Transportation Master Plans.

- Presents plans, reports and other findings to public and private clients, advisory boards, representatives of public agencies and elected officials.
- Conducts research and prepares reports on physical terrain, hazard mitigation property, land use, social and economic issues.
- Performs site inspections to gather data relevant to planning and urban design and development review process and/or to confirm that projects comply with approved plans.

Minimum Requirements
